Like his previous albums, Michael Stern's most recent album "We All Have Wings" focuses on kindness, love, and humor. Each song is brimming with entertaining life lessons set to music.

The instruments themselves resonate with cheerfulness; the mandolin, dobro, banjo, piano, fiddle, accordion, harmonica, and guitar team with the sweet children's vocals to create a charming composition that is appealing not only to children but to adults seeking youthful, upbeat music.

The music's fun and simplistic edge makes this a wonderful sing-along CD that promotes positive attitudes and choices. With a sound that falls somewhere between folksy and choir hymns, Stern's compilation is interlaced with lyrics that'll make you laugh and music that'll make you dance. Stern sings with enthusiasm and expressiveness, modeling the creativity and energy he encourages children to partake in.

It's obvious that Stern has been inspired by "love all around the world" as he shares his hopes for global harmony and peace. His songs about accepting people with different religions, skin colors, ethnicities, cultures, handicaps, and languages give children the courage to embrace diversity and seek unity.
